  - It's time to apply for City Boards & Commissions; applications are due by 2/17. (See attached flyer attached with these minutes.)
  - The Senior Commission meets tomorrow.
  - A new senior living facility, Aspendale, is under construction next to Centennial Hospital.

  - We have 2,025.66. Please, see the Treasurer's Report attached with these minutes.
- 3. Centennial Government and Special Districts (7 minutes each)
  - A. <u>18th Judicial District</u>, Jamie Sorrells, Dir. of Consumer Fraud rotection & Community En-gagement
    - The 18th Judicial Dist. is now divided. District 23 is made up of Douglas, Elbert, & Lin-coln Counties.
    - Sorrells will present on consumer fraud to any group, & other presentations.

- JD18 will continue to host Citizens Academies and will include a youth academy. They will, possibly, hold a hybrid academy to focus in on consumer protection.
- Jan. was Human Trafficking Awareness Month. It's theecond most profitable illegal industry after drugs. The typical age of entry is 13, aveerage # of sexual partners 668, average life expectancy of a trafficked person is 7 yrs. It's not always in places you'd expect. Learn how to recognize it. See the 18th JD website. We work with many agen-cies & the FBI
- Consumer Protection month is March.
- April is Sexual Assault Awareness month.
- Oct. is Domestic Violence Awareness month.
- The biggest problems now: tax scams; end of year, open enrollment for Medicare. Another big concern is cryptocurrency. (34,000 Crypto ATMs in the US)
- B. South Metro Fire Rescue, Kristin Eckmann
  - Sta. 15 on Dry Creek Rd. had a few delays but is close to finished. Crew moves in in Feb. An open house will be held the spring. Have you noticed how the new sta. fills the lot?
  - 3 SMFR Board seats are open, Dist. 2 (middle of Centennial) is one of them. There's a map on web, if you're interested in running. Nominations will be taken through 2/28.
  - We just graduated a fire fighter/paramedic class. We've opened applications for fire-fighters through 2/9 and firefighter/paramedics through 3/2
  - CA fires: We deployed a 4 person team arriving back home tonight or tomorrow morn-ing
  - We had a portion of I-25 from C-470 to Belleview dedicated as the Firefighter Memorial Hwy for Chief Jackson, a line of duty death.
  - We're participating in CDOT's Adopt-a-Hwy program, we've taken Colorado Blvd. from Arapahoe to Orchard (?).
  - The Fire Chief selection process is down to 3 applicants. An announcement on the final choice should be made by mid-Feb. There will be a Change of Command ceremony in April.
  - We have a piece of metal from the 9/11 attack outside of our HQ.
- B. <u>Trails Park & Rec.</u>, <u>Ryan Bailey</u>, Asst. Exec. Director
  - Spring/Summer registration for all spring/summer programs (summer camps & more) starts 2/10, on our website.
  - There was a burst pipe under the Trails Center's lap pool. It's out of commission until the end of Feb.
  - We're contracting with an interior designer to give Trails Rec. Center a refresh; we will maintain the mountain lodge-look.
  - In May, CeCON should be back at Trails again.

  - The Cenennial Arts Council has a show at the Village Workspace on Trafficking on Thurs.
  - Council members have been attending legislative breakfasts. Centennial hired a lob-byist to track legislation affecting cities.
  - We will attend the Governor's State of the State luncheon, Wed.
  - We'll tour a homeless facility in Aurora later this week.

- Shea Properties is redeveloping an office building near Belleview & Monaco into 143 low income apartments paid for by private activity bonds from Englewood, Centennial, Denver, state, & federal funds.
- Snow removal: we've passed an amendment to our snow clearing ordinance: commer-cial properties must clear their outer sidewalks (on the street) of ice & snoww ithin 24 hrs., money penalties have been increased. You can see where plows are on our web-site.
- The City had a snowplow naming contest to name 43 plows.
- About 10K people attended Centennial-sponsored events in Center Park.
- The Citizen response phone is 303-325-8000. They received 21,000 calls Jan-Nov., 2024. There were 2000 were web requests.
- Check our website to see what's happening where in the city.
- This will be a Centennial election this year: mayor is term limited & one seat in each district is up for election.
- Over the next week, they will be doing the Point in Time Count for unhoused people.
- Centennial has been recognized internationally on how we handled pickleball issue.

## 4. Planned Program

- Cherry Creek Innovation Campus, Steve Day, Principal
- We opened 2019. with 7 pathways: 2 on aircraft, auto mechanics, CNA,, RN, hospitality & culinary, AI programming, OT & PT, construction, manufacturing & product design. We have a lot of industry partners. We host a hiring fair in April.
- We'll add 130K sf to our facility. We're currently at 127K sf.
- 80% of those students who come through our program go on to college but, we offer industry certifications in each pathway so they can go out & get a job right after high school.
- We bring every 8th grader in the district through for a tour. We require applications and about 1,000 students get chosen.
